Graduation Requirements

Foundation + Endorsement

- House Bill 5
- 26 Credits (22 Foundation Credits + 4 Endorsement Credits)
 - 4 English
 - 4 Math
 - 4 Science
 - 3 Social Studies (4 for class of 2024)
 - 2 Credits of the same foreign language
 - 1 Credit of Fine Arts
 - 1 Credit of Physical Education
 - 7 Elective Credits (6 for 2024)

Attendance is Required!

In order to receive credit for courses in high school, students must attend each class at least 90% of the time. This means each class can only be missed between 4-5 days. Credit is given based on attendance in each individual class, not a certain time of the day.

Examples of absences that do NOT affect credit:

- School related activities- sports, band, extracurricular event
- Doctor visits with a valid excuse
- Immediate family emergency, funeral
- Military visits

****Written parent notes WILL NOT completely excuse an absence, these do count towards loss of credit!**

STEM

All students who entered 9th grade at Bellville High School 2020 or thereafter will earn the **Multidisciplinary Studies Endorsement** by completing 4 credits in each of the core subject areas: English, Math, Science, & Social Studies.

Students can earn more endorsements depending on the coursework they complete before graduation.

STEM

A STEM Endorsement is earned by completing:

- 5 credits in Math : Algebra I, Geometry, Algebra II, and two advanced math courses

OR

- 5 credits in Science: Biology, Chemistry, Physics, and two Advanced Science Courses

Business & Industry

A Business and Industry endorsement can be earned by completing a coherent sequence of 4 or more credits with at least two in the same career cluster including including at least one advanced CTE course:

- Agriculture: Animal Studies
- Agriculture: Plant Studies
- Agriculture: Applied Agriculture Engineering
- Entrepreneurship: Automotive
- Entrepreneurship: Business
- Entrepreneurship: Construction

Public Services

A public services endorsement endorsement can be earned by completing a coherent sequence of 4 or more credits with at least two in the same career cluster including including at least one advanced CTE course:

- Health: Nursing
- Health: Emergency Services
- Education: Teaching
- Law: Law Enforcement

Arts & Humanities

An Arts and Humanities endorsement is earned by completing:

- A coherent sequence of four credits from one or two disciplines in fine arts:
 - Band, Art, Theatre Arts, Technical Theatre, Theatre Production

Distinguishment Level of Achievement

A student may earn a distinguished level of achievement by successfully completing:

- A total of four credits in Math including **Algebra II**
- A total of four credits in Science
- Remaining curriculum requirements
- Curriculum requirements for at least one endorsement

***A student must earn distinguished level of achievement to be eligible for top 10% automatic admission.

Benefits of Distinguished Level of Achievement

- Eligible for a TEXAS grant to help pay tuition and fees if financially qualified
- More competitive applicant
- More options for colleges and universities
- More financial aid options
- More prepared for college-level coursework
- Opportunity for immediate enrollment in classes for field of study
- Strong foundation to complete credential or degree

Performance Acknowledgements

A student may earn a performance acknowledgement for:

- Outstanding performance:
 - In a dual credit course
- At least 12 hours with a grade equivalent of 3.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale
 - In bilingualism and biliteracy
 - English 4 + 3 years of same foreign language with grade of 80 or above in all classes
 - On an AP Exam
 - A score of 3 or higher on a College Board AP Exam
- On the PSAT, the ACT-Plan, the SAT, or the ACT
 - Earning a score on the PSAT that qualifies the student for recognition as commended scholar or higher
 - A combined critical reading and mathematics score of at least 1250 on the SAT
 - A composite score of 28 on the ACT (excluding the writing)

Automatic Admission

In accordance with Texas Education Code (TEC), §51.803, a student is eligible for automatic admission to a Texas public college or university as an undergraduate student if the student earned a grade point average in the **top 10 percent** of the student's high school graduating class or in the percentage of qualified applicants that are anticipated to be offered admission to the University of Texas at Austin* (~ **top 6%**), and the applicant

- (1) successfully completed the requirements for the Recommended High School Program (RHSP) or the Distinguished Achievement Program (DAP);
- (2) **earned the distinguished level of achievement under the Foundation High School Program**; or
- (3) satisfied ACT's College Readiness Benchmarks on the ACT assessment or earned on the SAT assessment a score of at least 1,500 out of 2,400 or the equivalent.

AP Courses

- Bellville High School offers a variety of AP Courses
- Students can earn college credit if they earn a qualifying score (3, 4, or 5) on an AP Exam
- Tests cost approximately \$95 and the school will reimburse the exam fee for students that earn a 3 or better on an AP exam
- Advanced courses are encouraged to best prepare students for the rigor of AP classes.
- Planning is important beginning 9th grade year if a student is interested in taking an AP course
- Students typically begin taking AP courses their junior year

Dual Credit

- Dual Credit allows a student to fulfill a high school graduation requirement and earn college credit for the same class.
- Dual Credit classes follow the college calendar and adhere to college policies and procedures, specifically in regards to attendance.
- Student will have a permanent college transcript.
- Eligibility:
 - Completed sophomore year of high school
 - Overall Average of B in completed coursework
 - Must demonstrate college readiness with scores on the TSIA 2 Assessment or be exempt

End of Course Exams

- Students will be required to pass STAAR End of Course Exams in 5 content areas to be eligible to graduate:
 - Algebra 1
 - Biology
 - English 1
 - English 2
 - U.S. History

PSAT

- The PSAT will be offered in October to students in the 11th, 10th & 9th grades. Registration begins in September in the counseling office.

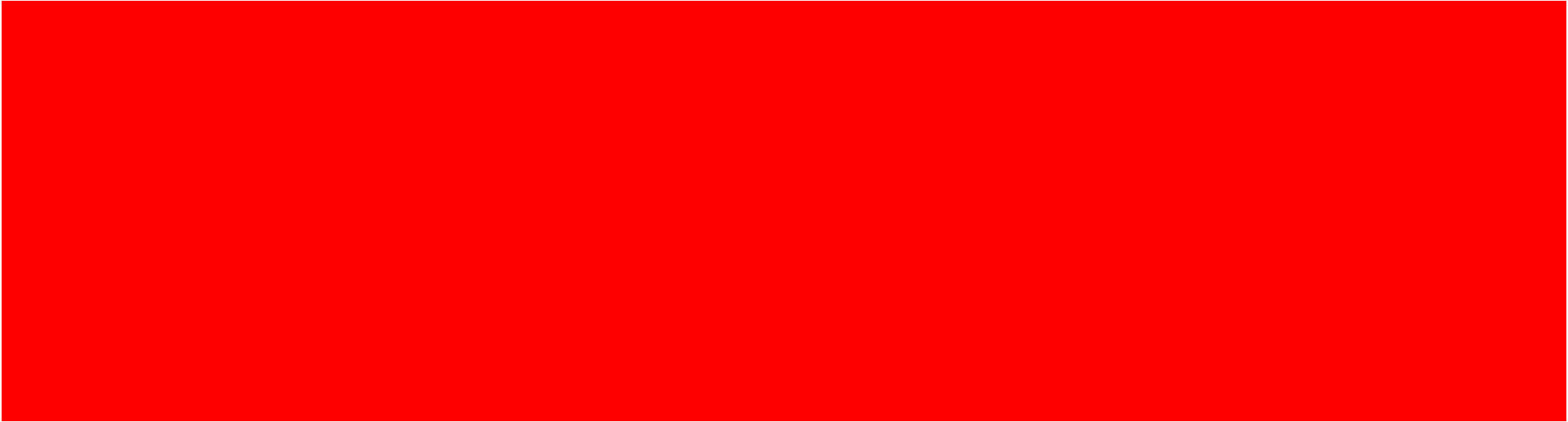
SAT & ACT

- Students may sign up for classes that need teacher approval but will be changed into the alternates if approval is denied.
- Teacher Approvals are needed for:
 - Athletics
 - Band (Audition means teacher approval)
 - Drill Team (Brahmadoras)
 - Debate
 - Theatre Production
 - Ag Leadership
 - Advanced Floral Design
 - Yearbook

How will course selection work?

- Students have been given their Course Request forms.
- Please review the courses chosen carefully!
- Course request forms are DUE to the Counseling Office by **February 23rd**.
- You will receive a printed copy of the courses you requested for next year in April. Prerequisites will be checked along with teacher approval. Changes may be made if the requirements are not met.
- Changes to the courses requested can be made until **April 30th**.

Schedule Requests/Changes

- Schedule requests will be handed out after the counselors input the student information sometime in April. Any requests for changes should be made before **April 30th!!!**
- All students will have the opportunity to pick up schedules before the first day of classes for next school year as well.
- Schedule changes in the fall will be limited to correct scheduling errors or to equalize class enrollments after the first day of school for 2024-2025.

Advanced Course Schedule Changes

- Students who request Advanced courses may:
 - request a schedule change to an on-level class by the END of the 3rd WEEK
 - at the end of the 1st 9 weeks or
 - at the end of 1st semester

***This may mean other schedule changes may occur, so please choose carefully for these classes!

- To ensure that credit is earned for the semester, if a student fails a grading period of the Advanced course, they will be advised to change into an on-level class.

- March 22, 2024 – Dual credit approval form due
